Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT)

The Japanese-Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) has been offered by the Japan Foundation and Japan Educational Exchanges and Services.

The JLPT examination is held worldwide to evaluate and certify proficiency in Japanese of non-native speakers.

The Japan Foundation and Japan Educational Exchanges and Services have jointly conducted the test. Outside Japan, the Japan Foundation administers the test in cooperation with local institutions.

Course Structure

KATAGANA

Katakana is a Japanese syllabary. It is one of the four components of the Japanese writing system, along with hiragana, kanji, and in some cases the Latin script (known as rōmaji). Katakana is used to write foreign-language and loan words or onomatopoeia. The word katakana means "fragmentary kana", as the katakana characters are derived from components or fragments of more complex kanji.

HIRAGANA

Hiragana is a Japanese syllabary, part of the Japanese writing system, along with katakana as well as kanji. It is a phonetic lettering system. The word hiragana means "common" or "plain" kana (originally also "easy", as contrasted with kanji). Hiragana and katakana are both kana systems.

KANJI

Kanji refers to ideograms in the Japanese writing system that are adapted from Chinese characters. They represent ideas, objects, or qualities and are one of the two main systems used to write Japanese, alongside the kana syllabaries (hiragana and katakana). There are over 50,000 kanji characters, but only 2,136 are commonly used and taught in schools.
